



Information Document for facing the COVID-19 emergency during events

(articles 36 and 37 of the Italian Consolidated Act on Occupational Health and Safety, no. 81/2008)

#GIRO

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Following the COVID-19 emergency, and pursuant to the provisions set forth by the Italian Legislative Decree of February 23, 2020, **RCS Sport** has suspended all the sporting events scheduled for 2020, starting with the opening round of the cycling season, “Strade Bianche”, due to take place on March 7, 2020.

With reference to the **Prime Ministerial Decree (DPCM) of August 07, 2020 and September 07, 2020** as regards the resumption of organized sports activities (including competitions), and in the light of the new UCI road racing calendar, in which “Strade Bianche” was rescheduled to August 01, 2020, RCS Sport has set up a working group that, considering the current national legislation on the containment of the COVID-19 infection, has drafted a document aimed at defining appropriate “epidemiological risk mitigation measures for organizing and conducting cycling events”.

For this purpose, RCS Sport and GAe Engineering have explored the relevant emergency containment measures and, specifically, the measures to reduce the risk of transmission of SARS-CoV-2 to be put in place in order to ensure that sporting events – particularly, cycling competitions – are conducted with due regard for the health and safety of all the parties involved, including the organisers, staff members, the riders and the public, as well as any attendees across all areas of a cycling event.

This notice was drafted from, and is an excerpt of, the above-mentioned document, which includes all the relevant measures to prevent the spread of infection.

COMMITTEE

RCS Sport will set up a Committee for defining, implementing and verifying the rules of the Regulatory Protocol (as provided for in the shared Regulatory Protocol on the contrast and containment measures against the transmission of SARS-CoV-2 in the workplace of March 14, 2020, and in the following Prime Ministerial Decrees). The Committee will include figures that will follow the cycling events, so as to assess and ensure that the measures planned are actually implemented.

THE COMMITTEE WILL INCLUDE FIGURES INVOLVED IN ORGANISING AND MANAGING THE EVENT IN VARIOUS CAPACITIES:

- Employer
- Prevention and Protection Service Officer (RSPP)
- Company medical officer
- Director of cycling races
- Operations Director for cycling races

COVID MANAGER

In order to regulate the entire management and information process on the relevant virus containment measures, a figure should be appointed as unique contact person, belonging to the Committee themselves.

This figure can be compared to a COVID Manager, namely a coordinator assisting in implementing any prevention and control measures, and serving as a contact point across the stakeholders involved in implementing the Plan.

THE COVID MANAGER WILL BE ASSISTED BY THEIR REPRESENTATIVES ACROSS THE DIFFERENT EVENT AREAS.

RCS ORGANISATION

In its capacity as event organiser, RCS Sport employs approximately 300 professionals (including employees, co-workers and self-employed staff) on its cycling events.

DETAILED INFORMATION ABOUT THE DEPARTMENTS INVOLVED CAN BE FOUND BELOW:

MANAGEMENT: staff in charge of the technical direction of the race, jury, accreditation and secretariat, teams relations, institutions/local authorities relations, motorcycle escort, medical service, race radio, hotel services and neutral support services

MARKETING AND COMMUNICATION DEPARTMENT: staff in charge of managing press, web and social media content, as well as marketing activities

SALES DEPARTMENT: staff in charge of managing sponsors relations, as well as Sales Marketing and Licensing activities

OPERATIONS DEPARTMENT: staff in charge of planning and designing structures set-up and installation, of defining travel arrangements (flights, ferry or road transfers), of coordinating all suppliers and of managing set-up operations on site

TV PRODUCTION AND MEDIA RIGHTS: : staff in charge of managing the relations with the Host Broadcaster of the event (RAI), as well as with all the other national and international broadcasters that have acquired broadcasting rights for any event

SPECIAL PROJECTS DIVISION: staff in charge of organising any accessory project (exclusive sponsor hospitality areas at the finish and/or along the route), as well as the Giro E

PREVENTION AND PROTECTION SERVICE OFFICE: staff in charge of coordinating H&S projects, as well as of ensuring coordination between the Local health authorities (ASL), the Rescue Coordination Centre (COSP), the Police Panel, and the provincial/municipal supervisory committees on public entertainment venues

ADMINISTRATION AND CONTROL DEPARTMENT: staff in charge of corporate administration

Other figures shall receive specific information and/or training on how to address the health emergency, namely:

BEFORE THE RACE

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE)

In its capacity as employer, RCS Sport will provide their staff with masks and gloves, on a regular and as-needed basis, before the start of the event. All staff members are required to use the PPE provided while carrying out their duties in the venues and premises where the event is taking place.

Guests and spectators will only be allowed to access their dedicated areas set up by RCS Sport if they are wearing the required personal protective equipment.

If something unexpected happens (e.g. if PPE is lost or broken), additional gloves and masks will be available at the start, at the finish and by the Race HQ.

HOTELS

Hotel reservations will be made by RCS Sport via a specialised company, which will assess that any accommodation facility has complied (by way of declaration) with the applicable prevention and protection regulations to reduce the risk of COVID-19 infection, including (but not limited to): respect of physical distancing, presence of partitions at the reception, frequent cleaning and sanitisation of all the rooms and common areas, etc.

[DPCM of June 11, 2020, Annex 9, Accommodation Facilities].

TRANSPORT

Travel by air, train and boat will be conducted in compliance with the applicable rules of conduct, prevention and protection envisaged in the relevant protocols issued by the individual travel companies; anyone travelling with said companies will be required to comply with such rules (e.g. wearing face masks and gloves) [DPCM of June 11, 2020, Annex 15 - Public transport].

With respect to the cars and the vehicles used by the Organisation, RCS Sport has established that any vehicle will be sanitised before being delivered to their designated driver. Moreover, each car will be equipped with a sanitisation kit that shall be used daily, especially if the vehicle is used by any third party. In addition to the driver, two passengers can be permitted on board each car, in the back seats, by the windows. Both the passengers and the driver shall be wearing face masks.

For passenger vans and shuttles, consistently with vehicle capacity, one passenger will be permitted to seat beside the driver, and two passengers will be allowed for each row of seats, sitting by the windows.

All the vehicles of the Organisation that will be used in the race, also for carrying passengers, and that may be used by a different driver every day will be sanitised before delivery; sanitisation will be repeated daily, before the vehicle is delivered to the assigned driver.

The use of motorcycles for work-related reasons is permitted to two people, wearing a full-face helmet, either keeping their visor down or wearing a face mask.

Concerning the vehicles used by teams, suppliers, authorities/local committees, guests and invites, sponsors and media, any sanitisation procedure, as well as the compliance with the relevant protection and prevention rules, shall be the responsibility of the different users, who shall provide formal evidence of having implemented adequate protocols in line with the provisions set forth in this document.

In order to prevent the spread of SARS-CoV-2, all suppliers are required to share their corporate protocols with RCS Sport, and to provide their staff members (employees or contracted personnel) who will be working on the event with the relevant PPE required by the regulations (e.g. face masks and disposable gloves).

DURING THE RACE

RCS Sport personnel will be on-site at the race venue to arrange and set up the relevant areas required for the competition to take place (start and finish areas, route, etc.)

Those people will be on-site several hours before any race-related activity is initiated, when no structure has been set up yet.

Therefore one person for each area shall be appointed to screen the **Organisation staff for fever, before they start to work on-site**. Temperature assessment must be performed as the very first step upon arrival on-site, by the relevant designated personnel.

All suppliers and other users of the working areas are required **to certify** that all their staff members have a body temperature below 37.5 °C at the start of each working day, as measured by their own attendant, and are also required of notifying the organiser of any (smallest) change of their health conditions.

The conduct required from each worker during the race will depend on the features of their working area.

As a general rule, they shall implement the measures listed in the table under «**GENERAL MEASURES FOR WORKERS INVOLVED IN CYCLING COMPETITIONS**».

More specifically, reference shall be made to the measures listed for each area in this document, under «**CYCLING-RELATED ACTIVITIES**».

SANITARY MEASURES


All the people attending the events are required to abide by the following hygiene rules:

- Wash your hands often (all work spaces will be equipped with alcohol-based hand rubs)
- Wear the relevant PPE
- Avoid close contact with people suffering from acute respiratory infections
- Avoid hugs and handshakes
- Keep a distance of at least 1 meter in all social relations
- Do not leave any personal belongings in common areas
- Do not touch your eyes, mouth or nose with your hands
- Avoid sharing bottles and glasses
- Use a tissue for coughs and sneezes. If you don't have a tissue, sneeze into your elbow
- Safely dispose of used tissue and PPE in suitable containers





Outlined below are the measures to reduce the risk of transmission, proposed to the Ministry for the resumption of cycling events, to be implemented across specific areas:

Specific measures to reduce the risk of transmission shall be implemented at the start area, requiring accurate checks for access monitoring based on the predictable layout and arrangement for each stage start:

SIGNATURE PODIUM/TIME-TRIAL RAMP


this area is only accessible to the members of the organisation (for work-related purposes only), to the riders, and to a limited number of members of the authorities/local committee and of the media. The following measures will be implemented in this area:

- 1_ Separate pathways will be provided for entrance into and exit from this area.
- 2_ Body temperature measurement will be performed at the entrance of the fenced passage leading to the podium.
- 3_ In establishing the number of people expected to access the different dedicated areas, their pathways and their position, in the above context, proper consideration will be given to the relevant physical distancing requirements. Specific floor signs will be provided to this end, to mark the correct position based on the functions mentioned above and on the relevant dedicated areas [floor signs will be colour-coded to match that of the individual passes required to access specific areas].
- 4_ PPE must be worn by anyone who needs to access this area.
- 5_ Gel hand sanitisers will be available in this area, for anyone to use.
- 6_ The area will be cleaned and sanitised after each installation, following a certified protocol
- 7_ Portable toilets in this area will be sanitised at the start of each day, and regularly afterwards by dedicated personnel, while the start operations are underway

HOSPITALITY

This area is only accessible to guests and members of authorities/local committee with relevant passes, as well as to the catering service and to the members of the organisation (for work-related purposes only). The following measures will be implemented in this area:

- 1_ Separate pathways will be provided for entrance into and exit from this area, and pass control will be performed.
- 2_ Body temperature measurement will be performed at the entrance.
- 3_ PPE must be worn by anyone who needs to access this area (and can be provided, if they do not have their own).
- 4_ Gel hand sanitisers will be available in this area, for anyone to use.
- 5_ Buffet service is suspended; prepared and packaged food will be served. Catering staff will be wearing adequate PPE during both food preparation and service.
- 6_ Occupancy in each hospitality area will depend on the size of the area itself, and will be coherent with the social distancing rules. The available surface area for each stage will be calculated including the tables as well, so as to define maximum occupancy considering proper social distancing for both standing and sitting attendees.
- 7_ The area will be cleaned and sanitised after each installation, following a certified protocol.
- 8_ Portable toilets in this area will be sanitised at the start of each day, and regularly afterwards by dedicated personnel, while the start operations are underway.
- 9_ For compliance with the Safety requirements, specific points of passage will be provided to ensure evacuation from the area in the event of an emergency/urgency. Such points of passage will be marshalled, and may only be used in the circumstances listed above.

TECHNICAL AREA

Access to the technical area will only be permitted to a limited number of people, for work-related purposes only. The following measures will be implemented in this area:

- 1_ Separate pathways will be provided for entrance into and exit from this area.
- 2_ PPE must be worn by anyone who needs to access this area (and can be provided, if they do not have their own).
- 3_ The area will be cleaned and sanitised after each installation, following a certified protocol.
- 4_ Body temperature measurement will not be performed upon entrance, as the staff is already inside a “controlled” access area.



TV STUDIO AND TV COMPOUND

This area is only accessible to Broadcasters and to staff members of the organisation (for work-related purposes only). Access to the TV Studio is permitted to people to be interviewed, such as riders and authorities. The following measures will be implemented in this area:

- 1_ Separate pathways will be provided for entrance into and exit from this area.
- 2_ Body temperature measurement will be performed at the entrance.
- 3_ PPE must be worn by anyone who needs to access this area (and can be provided, if they do not have their own).
- 4_ Gel hand sanitisers will be available in this area, for anyone to use.
- 5_ These areas will be cleaned and sanitised after each installation by the individual Broadcasters, who shall provide formal evidence of having implemented adequate protocols.
- 6_ Portable toilets in this area will be sanitised at the start of each day, and regularly afterwards by dedicated personnel, while the start operations are underway.
- 7_ In carrying out their duties, each Broadcaster shall comply with the relevant mitigation measures defined in the protocol of their company and issued by individual committees. Individual protocols shall be harmonised to best coordinate the actions put in place.

ACCREDITATION AREA

This area is only accessible to members of the organisation (for work-related purposes), and to all accredited people. The following measures will be implemented in this area:

- 1_ PPE must be worn by anyone who needs to access this area (and can be provided, if they do not have their own).
- 2_ The area will be cleaned and sanitised after each installation, following a certified protocol.
- 3_ Body temperature measurement will not be performed upon entrance, as the staff is already inside a “controlled” access area.



PARKING AREA

This area is only accessible to teams complying with the relevant health protocol for this user category, as well as to the members of the organisation. The following measures will be implemented in this area:

- 1_ Only the teams parking area will be fenced off and closed to the public, in order to avoid crowding.
- 2_ Body temperature measurement will not be performed upon entrance, as this is already a “controlled” access area and moreover, temperature self-assessment is performed every morning at the start of each working day. Instead, body temperature measurement will be performed when leaving the parking area, heading towards the Signature Podium.
- 3_ Gel hand sanitisers will be available in this area, for anyone to use.
- 4_ For compliance with the Safety requirements, specific points of passage will be provided to ensure evacuation from the area in the event of an emergency/urgency. Such points of passage will be marshalled, and may only be used in the circumstances listed above.

SPONSOR VILLAGE

This area is open to public, only if registered, and sponsors. The following measures will be implemented in this area:

- 1_ Assessment of maximum occupancy
- 2_ Fence off the entire area, create separate entrance and exit gates
- 3_ Limited and marshalled access
- 4_ Temperature measurement and hand disinfection
- 5_ PPE required
- 6_ Proper spacing between stands, to prevent crowding and queues
- 7_ Safe distance between the attendees (on behalf of the sponsor)
- 8_ Possibility of sampling activities only respectation social distancing rules andwith gadget sanitised (on behalf of the sponsor)
- 9_ Regular sanitisation of areas of contact between public and exhibitors (on behalf of the sponsor)



The route is an area restricted to the teams and the riders, and to a few other members of the organisation and the media, in charge of managing the competition. All these user categories will have their body temperature measured at the start of each day, according to different procedures by user category.

THE ROUTE CAN BE DIVIDED INTO 3 AREAS

Start route (roll-out/neutralised section), namely the areas where the peloton lines up before the start, and the first metres of the riders moving forward

Itinerary, namely the areas along the race route.

Finish route (final kilometre), namely the last kilometre of a race, which is fenced off.

With respect to the start and finish route, little or no contact with third parties (which is likely to increase the risk of transmission) is expected, as opposed to what could happen along the route, given the absence of any barriers between the riders and the surroundings.

Specifically, riders will be subject to the applicable risk mitigation measures issued by the relevant cycling federations.

For the public, the provisions issued by the relevant Local governments via specific decrees shall apply.




Specific measures to reduce the risk of transmission shall be implemented at the finish area, requiring accurate checks for access monitoring based on the predictable layout and arrangement for each stage finish:

Home straight: it is defined as (approx.) the final 300 m of the route, and the following 100 m after the finish line, an area where RCS Sport still has some of its structures.

Access is only allowed to pass holders. From this part of the road, after going through all the checks above, people with a suitable accreditation may access the following areas: hospitality, grandstand, press unit, awards ceremony podium, TV Studio and TV Compound, technical area. It should be noted that accreditation badges define the accessible area(s) by profile level of the pass holder.

The following measures will be implemented in this area:

- 1_ The area will be entirely fenced off, creating one single entrance point and one single exit point.
- 2_ Body temperature measurement will be performed at the two access points (at the beginning of the home straight, or at the end of the post-finish stretch).
- 3_ Anyone willing to access through these entrance points must wear the required PPE.
- 4_ Giant screens will be installed for the public to watch the stage finale while preventing crowding.





AWARDS CEREMONY PODIUM

This area is only accessible (via the home straight) to the members of the organisation (for work-related purposes only), to the riders and their staff, and to a limited number of members of the authorities/local committee and of the media. The following measures will be implemented in this area:

- 1_ Separate pathways will be provided for entrance into and exit from this area.
- 2_ Body temperature measurement will be performed at the entrance of the fenced passage leading to the podium.
- 3_ In establishing the number of people expected to access the different dedicated areas, their pathways and their position, in the above context, proper consideration will be given to the relevant physical distancing requirements. Specific floor signs will be provided to this end, to mark the correct position based on the functions mentioned above and on the relevant dedicated areas [floor signs will be colour-coded to match that of the individual passes required to access specific areas].
- 4_ PPE must be worn by anyone who needs to access this area.
- 5_ Gel hand sanitisers will be available in this area, for anyone to use.
- 6_ The area will be cleaned and sanitised after each installation, following a certified protocol.
- 7_ Portable toilets in this area will be sanitised at the start of each day, and regularly afterwards by dedicated personnel, while the finish operations are underway.



HOSPITALITY

This area is only accessible to guests and members of authorities/local committee with relevant passes, as well as to the catering service and to the members of the organisation (for work-related purposes only). The following measures will be implemented in this area:

- 1_ Separate pathways will be provided for entrance into and exit from this area, and pass control will be performed.
- 2_ Il rilevamento della temperatura corporea verrà fatto all'ingresso.
- 3_ PPE must be worn by anyone who needs to access this area (and can be provided, if they do not have their own).
- 4_ Gel hand sanitisers will be available in this area, for anyone to use.
- 5_ Buffet service is suspended; prepared and packaged food will be served. Catering staff will be wearing adequate PPE during both food preparation and service.
- 6_ Occupancy in each hospitality area will depend on the size of the area itself, and will be coherent with the social distancing rules. The available surface area for each stage will be calculated including the tables as well, so as to define maximum occupancy considering proper social distancing for both standing and sitting attendees.
- 7_ The area will be cleaned and sanitised after each installation, following a certified protocol, as well as while being used by accredited guests
- 8_ Portable toilets in this area will be sanitised at the start of each day, and regularly afterwards by dedicated personnel, while the finish operations are underway.
- 9_ For compliance with the Safety requirements, specific points of passage will be provided to ensure evacuation from the area in the event of an emergency/urgency. Such points of passage will be marshalled, and may only be used in the circumstances listed above.

DOPING CONTROL AREA

This area is only accessible to the Medical Personnel complying with the relevant health protocol for this type of activities, and to the riders undergoing doping control, with just one member of their team accompanying them. This area can only be accessed via the home straight. The following measures will be implemented in this area:

- 1_ PPE must be worn by anyone who needs to access this area.
- 2_ The area will be cleaned and sanitised after each installation, following a certified protocol.



GRANDSTAND

this area is only accessible to pass holders and to staff members of the organisation (for work-related purposes only). This area can be accessed via the home straight, or from behind the structures.

The following measures will be implemented in this area:

- 1_ Separate pathways will be provided for entrance into and exit from this area, and pass control will be performed.
- 2_ Body temperature measurement will be performed at the entrance.
- 3_ PPE must be worn by anyone who needs to access this area.
- 4_ Gel hand sanitisers will be available in this area, for anyone to use.
- 5_ Occupancy will depend on the size of the area, and will be coherent with the social distancing rules. Specific warning signs will be used to forbid sitting in selected seats.
- 6_ The area will be cleaned and sanitised after each installation, following a certified protocol.

PRESS UNIT, TV STUDIO AND E TV COMPOUND

This area is only accessible to Broadcasters and to staff members of the organisation (for work-related purposes only). Access to the TV Studio is permitted to people to be interviewed, such as riders and authorities. The following measures will be implemented in this area:

- 1_ Separate pathways will be provided for entrance into and exit from this area.
- 2_ Body temperature measurement will be performed at the entrance.
- 3_ PPE must be worn by anyone who needs to access this area (and can be provided, if they do not have their own).
- 4_ Gel hand sanitisers will be available in this area, for anyone to use.
- 5_ These areas will be cleaned and sanitised after each installation by RCS Sport (Press Unit) and by the individual Broadcasters (TV Studio and TV Compound), who shall provide formal evidence of having implemented adequate protocols.
- 6_ Portable toilets in this area will be sanitised at the start of each day, and regularly afterwards by dedicated personnel, while the finish operations are underway.



PARKING AREA

This area is only accessible to teams complying with the relevant health protocol for this user category, as well as to the members of the organisation. The following measures will be implemented in this area:

- 1_ Only the teams parking area will be fenced off and closed to the public, in order to avoid crowding.
- 2_ Body temperature measurement will not be performed, as this is already a “controlled” access area.
- 3_ Gel hand sanitisers will be available in this area, for anyone to use.
- 4_ For compliance with the Safety requirements, specific points of passage will be provided to ensure evacuation from the area in the event of an emergency/urgency. Such points of passage will be marshalled, and may only be used in the circumstances listed above.

TECHNICAL AREA

Access to the technical area is only permitted to a limited number of people, for work-related purposes only. The following measures will be implemented in this area:

- 1_ Separate pathways will be provided for entrance into and exit from this area.
- 2_ PPE must be worn by anyone who needs to access this area (and can be provided, if they do not have their own).
- 3_ The area will be cleaned and sanitised after each installation, following a certified protocol.
- 4_ Body temperature measurement will not be performed upon entrance, as the staff is already inside a “controlled” access area.

OPEN VILLAGE

This area is open to public, only if registered, and sponsors. The following measures will be implemented in this area:

- 1_ Assessment of maximum occupancy
- 2_ Fence off the entire area, create separate entrance and exit gates
- 3_ Limited and marshalled access
- 4_ Temperature measurement and hand disinfection
- 5_ PPE required
- 6_ Proper spacing between stands, to prevent crowding and queues
- 7_ Safe distance between the attendees (on behalf of the sponsor)
- 8_ Possibility of sampling activities only respectation social distancing rules andwith gadget sanitised (on behalf of the sponsor)
- 9_ Regular sanitisation of areas of contact between public and exhibitors (on behalf of the sponsor)



RACE HQ

Access to the Race HQ is only permitted to a limited number of people, for work-related purposes (organisation, media, accreditations and hotel accommodation) and with suitable accreditation.

In the choice of the Race HQ, in addition to the features of the venue, consideration shall be given to the usability of said premises by the workers, ensuring social distancing and a clear distinction between the entrance and the exit point.

Body temperature measurement will be performed outside the building. PPE must be worn by anyone accessing this area (masks and gloves will be provided by the organisation, if they do not have their own).


Hand sanitizer dispenser stands will be provided at the entrance, as well as inside the premises.

Workstations will be arranged so as to ensure that safe distance is maintained between the operators accessing the area. Each workstation may be either personal and/or non-personal. In the latter case, the workstation shall be sanitised after each use.

Local committees are required to sanitise the premises before providing them, and to ensure constant cleaning of said premises, including toilet facilities, throughout the day.

All the structures and fittings that follow along with the race must be sanitised each time after being transported and re-installed. Buffet service is suspended. Should the local committee be willing to provide catering, such service shall comply with the provisions set forth in the DPCM of June 11, 2020 (Annex 9, Restaurants and catering).
